Was captain of the London Fields School eleven

Appeared for Croydon Common in 2 minor cup matches, scoring 1 goal

Played in Croydon Common's final ever match and scored five goals in the penultimate one

Played 3 minor matches for Tottenham Hotspur

Won a Football League Division 2 Championship medal with Tottenham Hotspur in 1920

Played in seven different positions for Charlton Athletic; including full back, half back and forward

Played in Charlton Athletic's first ever Football League match (1-0 at home to Exeter City on 27.8.1921) in Division 3

Played at least 29 times, possibly more, for Margate in the 1920-21 season, including twice after his move to Charlton Athletic

Scored two goals for Margate, with his appearances coming in the Kent League, the F.A. Cup and local Kent cup competitions

Was once sentenced to twelve months at the Old Bailey for theft

Known as "Kosher" for obvious reasons

Coached Tooting Town after his retirement

Died in King George's Hospital after a car accident

A glutton for work, full of dash
