Although universally known as LLOYD EVANS during his career, his actual name as per his birth certificate and baptism was James Lloyd EVANS
His birth certificate records him as being born at 39 St. Philip Street, Battersea to James, a house painter, and Mary
The 1901 Census records him as living at 26 Elsley Road in Battersea, aged 16, and a builder's clerk
Also apparently appeared in the Western League for Queens Park Rangers
In November 1905, he represented Surrey in a representative fixture against Norfolk
In a report on 27 February 1905 of a recent match between Queens Park Rangers and Millwall, the Athletic News recorded that " <i>He was fairly fast, and at times centred well, but was too easily pushed off the ball, and after receiving some very vigorous attentions, he acted on the old adage that discretion was the better part of valour.</i> "
Was reportedly signed by Southend United to play in the South Eastern League during the 1907-08 season
Appeared for the London F.A. in a 4-2 away defeat to the Birmingham F.A. in March 1909
When he signed for Southend United in September 1909, the Portsmouth Evening News suggested that he had previously appeared for Fulham
Married Heloise Lily Smith on 30 November 1912 in St. Marks Church, Battersea
In the 1939 National Register, he was recorded as married and an Accounts Clerk
