Jottings

Appeared for Croydon Common in 1 minor cup match, without scoring

Played once for Portsmouth in the Southern Charity Cup in 1901-02

Appeared in Southern League matches for three different clubs in 1901-02

Scored twice on his West Ham United debut in a 2-0 home win over Bristol Rovers on 21 December 1901

His name was frequently spelt as McDonald, although the Croydon press tended to favour MacDonald as the spelling

On Thursday 25 March 1909, he missed his train and hence did not arrive for the SEL match with West Ham United Reserves and so Croydon Common played with ten men and lost 3-9!

Served in the Royal Fleet Auxillary during WW1 as Bosun on a tanker, RFA Belgol, and on 4 November 1917 was logged as having deserted

The Royal Fleet Auxillary website records his death from drowning and states that he was a Donkeyman Greaser on the RFA Belgol at the time

His height was variously described as anywhere between 5ft 7in and 5ft 10in - with his weight between 10st 6lb and 11st 8lb

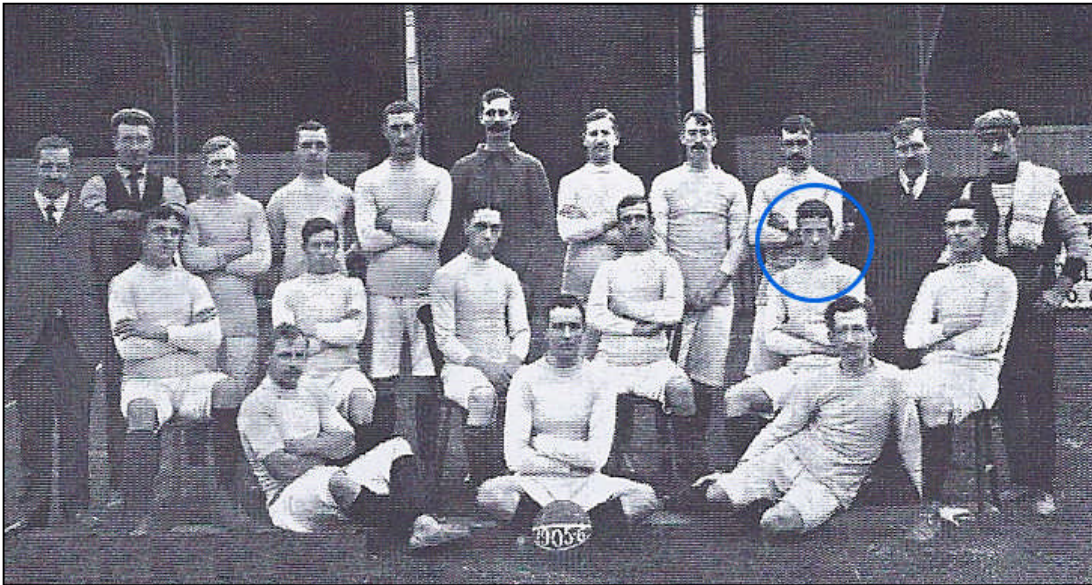
A brainy forward who uses his head for the benefit of the team in more senses than one
