His first club was the Great Eastern Locomotive Works
Scored a hat-trick on his debut for Croydon Common Reserves against Brentford Reserves
Appeared for Croydon Common in 3 minor cup matches, without scoring
Played for the Footballers' Battalion (F/73) until February 1919
Saw action in the war at Vimy Ridge, Loos, Cambrai and Lens
No first team appearances for Tottenham Hotspur - but played in a friendly against Crystal Palace in April 1919, with former Croydon teammate Dick Allman appearing for the Palace
Scored Charlton Athletic's first ever F.A. Cup hat-trick in a 6-0 home win over Catford Southend on 25.9.1920
Was apparently a very good billiards player
