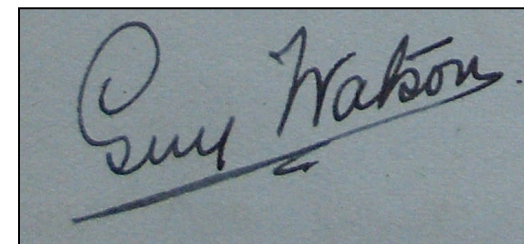

Appears to have always played as an amateur
His only appearance for Queens Park Rangers was in a 7-0 home win over Bristol Rovers
He made no first team appearances for Brentford
The Surrey Express recorded that he had a splendid game for Brentford in a 4-0 defeat against Portsmouth in the Western League in October 1907 and the report in The Sportsman suggested that he had previously played for London Caledonians
Appeared for both the London and the Middlesex select sides and at some point also appeared for London Caledonians
Appeared for Croydon Common in 1 minor cup match
Appeared for Croydon Common in at least three of the six matches on the Swedish tour in 1912
Played a total of 25 matches for Enfield in 1913-14 and reportedly retired at the end of the season because of a knee injury
Played at least once for Woolwich Arsenal Reserves in 1913-14
Despite reports of his earlier retirement, his photograph appeared in the Woolwich Arsenal handbook for the 1914-15 season
According to the Woolwich Arsenal handbook for the 1914-15 season, he had previously "helped" Chelsea
The Woolwich Arsenal handbook for the 1914-15 season erroneously shows his age as 30 instead of 35
Was recorded in censuses as an insurance agent (1901) and an assurance inspector (1911)
In the 1911 census, he was recorded as married to Maud, with two young sons
The London Gazette of 9 November 1915 records him as being awarded a temporary commission as a lieutenant in the RNVR
Was also referred to in the Croydon press as Guy-Watson
